### The First Issue -- 1988

The design of the obverse of the 1988 100 peso coin is based on the historic 1874 one peso coin.<sup>2</sup> The diameter of this coin, and all other coins in the 100 peso series, is 38.25mm.

The reverse of all the 100 peso coin bears a portrait of Prince Philippe.<sup>3</sup>

The obverse and the reverse of this issue were designed by Serge Huard.

presentation to Prince Philippe and the Royal House. An extensive study of these will be published in a future issue of *The Steel Crown*.

### The Second Issue -- 1989

The obverse of this coin was designed by Nancy Huard. It shows a map of the Kingdom of Araucania and Patagonia with the royal coat of arms. This coin marks the occasion of Prince Philippe's historic first visit in the territory of the kingdom in 1989.

### The Third Issue -- 1990

The obverse of this coin was designed by Claude Huard.<sup>9</sup> It shows the *Entrecasteaux*,<sup>10</sup> the French man-of-war that carried Orelie-Antoine from France to Araucania in 1870. It also marks the 40th anniversary of Prince Philippe's succession.

### THE 100 PESO SERIES RESUMES

After a seven year hiatus in the production of Araucanian 100 peso coins-of-tradition, the series will be resumed. During the summer of 1997, seven new 100 peso coin will become available.

Five of the new coins will be part of the dynasty series commemorating the reigns of each of the first five sovereigns of the kingdom. In addition to the dynasty series, one coin will mark the wedding of Prince Philippe and Princess Elisabeth and another will commemorate Prince Philippe's 70<sup>th</sup> birthday.

The reverse of these new coins will bear the portrait of Prince Philippe, which is found on all Araucanian 100 peso coins.

The obverse of the new coins bear a

map of the kingdom and the royal coat of arms, as they are found on the obverse of the 1989 100 peso coin. Each year's issue will bear a different date and commemorative inscription.

### The Sixth Issue -- 1993

The sixth issue commemorates the reign of King Orelie-Antoine I, with the inscription: Orelie-Antoine I, 1860-1878.

### KINGDOM OF ARAUCANIA AND PATAGONIA SOVEREIGNS

Sovereigns from the Royal House of Araucania and Patagonia have been issued each year since 1988. The design of the obverse of the sovereigns changes each year, but certain features remain constant:

On the reverse is a profile portrait of Prince Philippe by Serge Huard. The edges of all the Sovereigns are reeded and the diameter is 32.50 cm.

Now we will discuss the annual issues, focussing on what makes them distinctive.

### 1988 "New Year" Soberano

The first Soberano marks the coming of the New Year, 1989. The obverse shows a map of the world as seen from the North Pole.<sup>1</sup> The obverse was designed by Serge Huard. The total and final issue of this issue was as follows:

### 1989 "Christmas" Soberano

The second Soberano commemorates Christmas 1989. The obverse, which was designed by Fred R. Zinkhann, is of a stylized high-relief ice crown<sup>8</sup>

### 1991 "Christmas" Soberano

The fourth Soberano commemorate Christmas 1991 and bears a design by Jerome H. Remick and Serge Huard of the Madonna and Christ in her arms and two angels.<sup>11</sup>

<sup>9</sup> This program was produced late in November of 1989. Because there was a spelling error in the Spanish inscription (i.e., "Felix" instead of the correct spelling "Felices") and not enough time to cut a new die, it was decided to stop the minting immediately and to close the program. Because of this, the mintages are very low and only a few specimens reached collectors and the public.
